

PREACHING/TEACHING MINISTER

Position Overview

Ministry Objective

To proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ within the congregation and within the local community through effective preaching and teaching of God's Word, to seek and save the lost, to strengthen and encourage the saints, and to equip the members of the congregation to go and do the same so that by all means we might help people reach their eternal reward in heaven.

Accomplishment Criteria

To preach, teach, equip, build up, and challenge disciples to put their faith into action.

Position Summary

In this role you would be a leader within the congregation who serves as part of a ministry team under the oversight of the congregation's elders. Specifically, this position serves as a preacher, teacher, and counselor, to the members of the congregation and in the local community at large. You must be able to relate and communicate with all age groups. The preaching/teaching minister strategically drives the planning of ministry functions that achieve the job objective above. You will be expected to serve as a Christian role model in all aspects of your ministry, community involvement, and by being a faithful Christian in your family life.

Key Responsibilities

While we realize that specific responsibilities may develop over time through collaboration with our elders, ministry leaders, and in the development of your own spiritual strengths and gifts, these components serve as the basis for our expectations.

- Preaching:
 - Primary pulpit minister for Sunday services
 - Works with Worship Leader/team to effectively coordinate Sunday services
- Teaching:
 - Periodically teach class on Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings
 - Seeks out and conducts personal studies with individuals interested in learning more about Christ both within the congregation and in the community
- Visitation:
 - Visit members of the congregation who have lost loved ones, shut-ins, those with spiritual needs along with our elders, staff, and ministry leaders
 - Keep elders informed of member concerns
- Administration:
 - o Coordinates and works closely with the ministry teams and staff
 - Leads staff meetings to enhance coordination efforts within the congregation
 - o Performs additional duties as necessary for the smooth operation of the congregation



- Minimum Qualifications:
 - o A member of the Church of Christ who is sound in doctrine
 - o Competent in the use of office technology, including Microsoft Office
 - o Minimum Bachelor's degree with Bible emphasis; advanced degree preferred
 - Minimum three years of experience as a full-time pulpit minister or five years of parttime experience
